

## **Moving checklist**

We understand moving home can be a stressful and trying time. That's why we've put together a comprehensive moving checklist, designed to help you cope with the entire moving process from the second you decide to move until the moment you're settled in your new property.

| Two months before you move |  |  |

|                            | Get hold of a local paper or check the local area's websites to familiarise yourself with local government, community, social news and activities. |  |
|                            | Clean out cupboards.   |  |
|                            | If relocating due to a job move, check what costs your employer will cover.  |  |
| Six v                      | veeks before you move  |  |
|                            | Draw up a list of all your main possessions.   |  |
|                            | Decide which possessions you are taking to your new home, and where you will put the larger items.   |  |
|                            | Check whether your insurance policy will cover your move.  |  |
|                            | Research local schools.  |  |
|                            | Arrange to transfer your children's school records.  |  |
| Two weeks before you move  |  |  |
|                            | Check you have adequate prescription medicines to cover the moving period.   |  |
|                            | Safely dispose of all flammables e.g. Paints, Gas Bottles, Cleaning Fluids etc.  |  |
|                            | If your removal company is not making arrangements for you, book people to carry out services. e.g. Removing light fittings, House Cleaning        |  |
|                            | Cancel local deliveries and service, for example newspapers, gardener, cleaner, milk   |  |

| The day before you move        |   |  |

|                                | Walk through your house one last time to make sure everything is accounted for.   |  |
|                                | Strip beds.   |  |
|                                | Keep linens in a box that travels with you, so you can use them the first night.  |  |
|                                | Make sure you have the keys to your new home, or have arranged to collect them.   |  |
| The day of the move            |   |  |
|                                | Record all utility meter readings (gas, electricity, and water)   |  |
|                                | Stay until your movers have finished.   |  |
|                                | Check the traffic for your journey with keepmoving.com  |  |
|                                | Take one final look around to see if you forgot anything.   |  |
|                                | Before leaving check that all windows are secure and water, gas and electricity supplies are switched off.  |  |
|                                | You may be asked to sign a packing inventory/list: check carefully to ensure that you are happy with the content.   |  |
|                                | Give movers the directions to your new home, and an emergency number where you can be reached during the move.  |  |
| Once you have in your new home |   |  |
|                                | Make sure you are present when the removal crew arrives so you can guide them around the house confirming what is to be moved and any special instructions. |  |
|                                | Check the unloading of your items and account for each one on your packing inventory. Check carefully for any damaged or missing items.                     |  |
|                                | Place moving and other important documents in a safe place.   |  |
|                                | Go to the post office and collect held mail.  |  |

## After you have moved in

| Start cleaning and make the beds.                                |

| Plug in your telephones, answering machine and large appliances. |
| Unpack your 'survival kit'.                                      |
| Let older children organise their own rooms.                     |
| Settle younger children in one room with some toys and treats.   |
| If possible, keep pets away until you are settled in.            |
